



AmeriCorps Service Member Position with TerraCorps & Narrow River Land Trust

TerraCorps is a nonprofit organization working at the intersection of land conservation, sustainable farming, and local food systems to build local nonprofit capacity while growing the next generation of emerging leaders committed to making a difference at the community level. We value the power of local nonprofits to best understand and serve their communities, and our goal is to help them succeed by providing them access to the AmeriCorps national service model to build organizational capacity.

TerraCorps partners with a network of nonprofits in Massachusetts and Rhode Island focused on community needs related to local land conservation and sustainable agriculture. These partners act as service sites for a new cohort of AmeriCorps service members annually. Service members are paired with a site supervisor who provides guidance and mentorship while they learn to manage community programs and projects over a 1,700-hour service term. **The 2026–27 service year runs September 8, 2026, to July 30, 2027.**



Narrow River Land Trust is interviewing candidates for a Land Stewardship Coordinator (LSC). The LSC will engage with the Co-Chair, Board of Directors to manage volunteers on community service projects, educate or train individuals in environmental stewardship or environmentally conscious practices, and complete three capacity building projects.

Potential projects include:

- Collaborate with Board members and another TerraCorps service member to help prepare the Narrow River Land Trust for accreditation by conducting records audits, ensuring compliance with Land Trust Standards and Practices, managing records according to policy, and updating conservation management plans.
- Educate school children, stakeholders and the public about important historical, ecological and environmental information through the establishment of educational kiosks on its properties with trail systems.
- Engage the community and recruit volunteers through public events, outreach campaigns, social media, and partnerships.
